5TH INTERACTIVE SERIES OF "ZU DIALOGUES" "THE POWER OF #HASHTAGS: NAVIGATING THE SOCIAL MEDIA LANDSCAPE"

ZU Dialogues' fifth episode, which was held on 7 July 2021, discussed the importance of hashtags and how to navigate the social media landscape.

Our aim with this online dialogue session was to get opinions and analysis from experts about how influential a hashtag is, how social media impacts its users, how to appropriately use social media, and how we can make positive societal changes through its use.

Najia Ashar, Broadcast Journalist, Founder/President, Global Neighborhood for Media Innovation, while answering the question about the social media trending said "It creates a community of voices to talk about specific topics. Great thing about the hashtags is that they brought communities together during the times of natural disasters, tragedies, and sufferings. The biggest hashtag of 2015 was #blacklivesmatter. it was used more than 9 million times by the social media users.

However, talking about the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) Ms. Ashar carried out that you can be mindful of this because of the General Data Protection Regulation (GDPR) many social media apps ask people to allow data tracking so whenever you are downloading any app you can turn it off from its settings to avoid being tracked. Educate yourself about cookies, location, read terms and conditions, don't give privilege to companies to decide what they can do with our data.

Tehmina Lodhl, Associate Professor and Principal, Ziauddin College of Media Sciences, while presenting her argument about the cyber bullying said "cyber bullying can be very devastating for a person psychologically as well as physically. According to a research report around 13% of the teens reported being cyber bullied at least once in their

life and that's quite a high percentage. There is so much access to viral content, pornography, so much racists content, homophobic, religious based content so we should keep people informed about their rights that how can they handle because it's quite difficult for a person to handle it individually."

On questions about the social media's



effect on a person's mental health Ms. Lodhi said that multiple studies have found that there is a heavy link with depression, anxiety, loneliness, self-harm and even suicidal thoughts; it also promotes negative experiences.

While presenting his argument about the power of hashtag, Kamal Siddiqi, Director, Centre for Excellence in Journalism at IBA in Karachi said "social media is much more independent as compared to mainstream media. We can observe from the past few years that the mainstream media is heavily censored. If a person wants to look for some news or something happening, people will go to twitter rather than some major news publication that shows the importance and power of social media. In our country people are using social media for highlighting their problems, grievances,

and sharing their stories. Government is also using social media for making announcements regarding different issues. So, it becomes the prime source of information and we have noticed the government takes quick action against issues that become viral through social media".

Presenting the contrasting dialogue about the government's usage of social media he stated, "Today's government takes social media very seriously as compared to previous governments. This government is very sensitive about its image on social media, possibly that's why they have invested so much on social media. If you look at the armed forces, ISPR they also have taken social media very seriously. Most importantly, what we are seeing is that most of our ministers, politicians, stakeholders, opinion leaders are now using social media, especially twitter to issue statements. Government not only using social media but also taking action against highlighted wrong doings in the country".

Guest Speaker of the ZU Dialogues Brittney Stewart, Spokesperson, U.S. Consulate General, Karachi while talking about the rise and uses of social media said that according to data report number of social media users have been doubled than January 2016 that means 1 billion social media users have been added to the global total in the past three years. Growth of social media penetration has increased year to year. We have seen this growth increasing since and during the outbreak of COVID-19. During this pandemic the UN had already warned the world about the upcoming fear, uncertainty, and negative impact of social media on people's mental health. As we saw the growth and rise of social media in 2020 this level of social media activism is taken to the whole new level.

ONLINE SESSION: MYTHS AND REALITY OF EASTERN MEDICINE

On 30th August 2021, the Student Council ZUFEMNS in association with The Office of Student Affairs Ziauddin University held a webinar, titled "Myths and realities of Eastern Medicine during COVID-19 Pandemic"

Dr. Faisal Siddiqui, HOD of Department of Basic Medicinal and Behavioral Sciences at Faculty of Ziauddin University Faculty of Eastern Medicine and Natural Sciences - ZU.

His area of specializations is stress management and insomnia. The aim of the webinar was to inform the students how Eastern Medicine can be of help in treating different diseases and he clarified the myths associated with Eastern Medicine. Ziauddin University organised the 6th edition of "ZU Dialogues", titled "Jinnah's Vision of Pakistan: You are Free to go to your Temples..." on August 11 2021. This was held to get an opinion and analysis of the experts about Quaid-e-Azam

Muhammad Ali Jinnah's vision, religious freedom, democracy, equality, rights of minorities, social and cultural differences among ethnicities. The dialogue session was moderated by Syed Muaz Shah, Director, The Centre for Human Rights, Faculty of Law, Ziauddin University.

Prof. Dr. Syed Jaffar Ahmed, Director, Institute of Historical and Social Research Dean, Faculty of Social Sciences, Sohail University while talking about the historical context of Quaid-e-Azam Muham-Ali Jinnah's mad Presidential Address to the first Constituent Assembly on 11 August, 1947 said that Quaid gave a vision of future Pakistan.

While talking about Objective Resolution he said "Objective Resolution does talk about the people the federation and democracy see the framing of the words "sovereignty over the entire universe belongs to Allah Almighty" Congressmen were sitting there; non-Muslims were sitting there in the Constituent Assembly and Mr. Jinnah presenting a resolution to them that's where the differences started from because it was taken in wrong context and presented as if we want only Muslims to live in this country. Which is totally wrong.

Quaid-e-Azam did talk about Islam but he never discouraged the other religions of this country."



"PAKISTAN MEDIA DEVELOPMENT AUTHORITY: PROTECTION OR CONTROL OF THE MEDIA INDUSTRY"

Ziauddin University organised the 7th interactive series of "ZU Dialogues", titled "Pakistan Media Development Authority: Protection or Control of the Media Industry" to get an opinion and analysis of the experts about Pakistan Media Development Authority (PMDA) on September 17, 2021.

The dialogue session was moderated by

Syed Muaz Shah, Director, The Centre for Human Rights, Faculty of Law, Ziauddin University.

"In Pakistan we have extraordinarily high freedom of expression but virtually every day whether it is tv channel, social media or any newspaper, are condemnable there comments on our armed forces, judiciary, politicians, and their alleged or real corruption. So, there is no restriction on the kind of criticism that can be heard against people. But here, I empathize with journalists it is a fact that for the past 20 years a reported number of about 70 journalists have tragically lost their lives in a natural violent way and no one has been

found and punished for such terrible crimes, several others have been injured, some journalists have been deprived of their professional income. it is also true that media in Pakistan has a very high level of freedom of expression", said Senator (R) Mr. Javed Jabbar Former Federal Minister for Information & Broadcasting, Former Advisor to the Chief Executive of Pakistan on National Affairs presenting his argument about freedom of expression. He was presenting his arguments as a guest speaker of the webinar.

As a panelist of the webinar Mr. Mazhar Abbas, senior journalist and analyst, former General Secretary, Pakistan Federal Union of Journalists, (while talking about the control of fake news) he said, "If you go through the proposed draft which was floated by the Federal Information Minister Mr. Fawwad Chaudhary, out of 7 legislations at least 5 have nothing to do with fake news. For instance, the Motion Pictures Act 1979 what it has to do with the fake news?

Newspaper Employees' Conditions of Service Act 1973 have nothing to do with the fake news, Press Council of Pakistan [whose chairman has not been appointed by the government for the last 3 years] has nothing to do with the fake news. News Agencies Books Registration Act 2002 has nothing to do with the fake news except for PEMRA to some extent there is not any single legislation that has anything to do with fake news. So, the basic idea of Mr. Fawad Chauhdry has serious contradictions or he has not read any of these 7 legislations."

"I can say with authority that the biggest source of fake news in Pakistan has

always been the Ministry of Information. Since its formation it has always been used. If you are pleasing the government and showing pro government statements in headlines then you get the maximum advertisements" he added

Talking about the challenges that media usually face, Dr. Huma Baqai, International Relations Expert and Political

Analyst, Former Associate Dean, Faculty of Business Administration, IBA said "Workers of private news channels are not independent; they do cater the needs of commodification, commercialisation and elite capture.

Presenting her argument about PMDA she said "Firstly, right now the government has created a problem for itself. This is the biggest blunder made by the government to give an opportunity to the broken opposition parties to unite back and use this PDMA agenda for their own good. Secondly, the Government has polarised the already polarised political situation and thirdly this political arrogance by the Imran khan government is also self-defeating.

Mr. Zarrar Khuhro, current affairs commentator and analyst while critically analysing the current situation said "Government said they are going to build the consensus and they have built it. Except the fact that they are 100% against the PMDA which is a rare achievement and I do want to applaud it. Government's greatest skill is where they need a scapple, they use a hammer and where they need a hammer, they use a bulldozer, for instance: just see the single curriculum and electronic voting machine"


